help keep us safe.



At Fryent Primary School, handwriting is taught 4–5 times per week. Following the Nelson Handwriting scheme from Reception to Year 6, all children begin writing with a pencil, progressing to using a pen when they are ready. We aim for all children, by the end of KS2, to have the ability to produce fluent, legible and speedy joined-up handwriting. We provide children with purposeful and plentiful opportunities to practise their handwriting regularly which should also be continued at home.

The Handwriting Panel

The Handwriting Panel are a group of children working with Ms Mistry to monitor, support and promote children to writing with a school pen. The panel will be trained to recognise the skills that children need to achieve, in order to write with a pen. The Handwriting Panel will award successful pupils a pen licence and a school pen

Pen Licence success criteria

Skill	Achieved
is the correct penal grip being used?	
Are all letters on the line?	
Are the lower-case letters formed in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place?	
Are capital letters formed correctly?	
Are lower-case letters formed of the correct size relative to one another?	
Are capital letters and digits written of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower-case letters	
Does the spacing between words reflect the size of the letters?	
is the handwriting consistent across different pieces of work?
